

# TONGUE & LIP TIE RELEASE for Infants & Children

## Frenectomy Procedure with CO<sub>2</sub> Laser



**The Frenectomy procedure is prescribed to release or modify the frenulum, a small fold of tissue that prevents proper movement of the lips or tongue. This is commonly known as a lip or tongue tie.**

**Dr. Mansour utilizes a CO<sub>2</sub> soft tissue laser to release the tongue or lip tie**

- CO<sub>2</sub> soft tissue laser technology is optimal for treatment of soft tissue conditions.
  - releases soft tissue with minimal discomfort for the child.
  - does not emit excessive heat.
- a brief procedure, it only takes a few minutes from start to finish

***Reduced recovery time means infants can nurse right away and children can quickly return to their routine!***

Know...?**

- CO<sub>2</sub> lasers are safely used in various dental, medical, and aesthetic treatments.
- Other uses include treating cold sores, canker sores, ulcers, as well as addressing skin discolouration and resurfacing of scars.

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# FAQS ANSWERED FOR YOUR FAMILY



## **How will a frenectomy help me and my child?**

- easier on nursing moms with better latching
- improved lip and tongue mobility.
- improved digestion
- improved tongue position for airway
- improved growth & development
- may also improve posture & movement.

## ***How long will I be doing after-care exercises with my child?***

6 weeks ensures results are maintained!

## ***How frequently do I need to do the after-care exercises?***

6 times each day, ideally – it seems like a lot, yet it's a gentle, brief series of exercises you can incorporate at routine times throughout the day.

## ***Is it possible for the tissue to regrow?***

This is a possibility, yet only rarely. Re-treatment may be necessary. Consistent after-care exercises during the 6 weeks following treatment is most effective for prevention.

## ***Will there be bleeding & discomfort?***

There can be some slight bleeding in the early stages, if any.



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
